

 There can be no future for the youth in the Pacific without developing coconuts.


COPRA

 Over 240,000 tons of copra is produced in the Pacific using roughly 1.5 billion coconuts.

With a value of 108 million.

 It is a low value activity of little interest to youth.

Industry in crisis

Over a billion dollars Philippines oil investment.

 Importing copra at a higher price than local Pacific oil mills can pay.

Pacific oil mills unviable and now idle

Proposed to use 3% of nuts from copra (50 million) to result in 50% additional export value of \$ 56 million.

 Within 5 years the demonstration effect is expected to more than double high value production.
