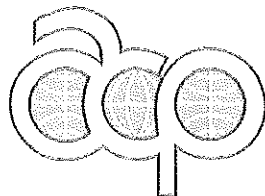

**ACP ACTION PLAN ON CLIMATE CHANGE**  
**2016 – 2020**

## Introduction

1. The twenty-first session of the Conference of the Parties (COP 21) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) took place from 30<sup>th</sup> November to 12<sup>th</sup> December 2015 in Paris, France.
2. In preparation for COP 21 the ACP Group of States developed an ACP Issues Paper on the Paris Climate Change Conference (COP 21) that outlined the issues of importance to the ACP including, but not limited to, nationally determined contributions, adaptation, mitigation, finance, technology development and transfer and capacity building.
3. For the 79 Member States of the ACP Group, preparing for the implementation of the Paris Agreement will be a priority. In this regard, the ACP Secretariat will, in collaboration with ACP Member States and relevant partners, concentrate on assisting ACP Member States and in particular, Small Island Developing States (SIDS) and Least Developed Countries (LDCs), to implement concrete actions to be undertaken during the period 2016 – 2020.
4. The overall objective of the ACP Action Plan on Climate Change is to contribute to strengthening the global response to the threat of climate change in ACP Member States, while taking into consideration the Sustainable Development Goals and efforts to reduce poverty. The Action Plan will also contribute to enhancing action, prior to 2020 and before the entry into force of the Paris Agreement, on adaptation, mitigation, finance, technology development and transfer, capacity building and transparency of action and support.
5. The ACP Secretariat will also actively participate in the relevant meetings of the UNFCCC, and in particular the inter-sessional meetings of the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) and Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) as well as the meetings of the Conference of the Parties (COP), in order to monitor the overall implementation of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change to be better able to assist ACP Member States to implement the provisions contained therein.
