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


General Context

- ☐ Total Population: 869,458 (2015)
 - urban population 51%

Country Risk Profile:

- → Natural Hazards
 - Tropical Cyclones, Earthquakes
 - Riverine and coastal flooding
- Major Risk [PCRAFI]
- AAL F\$158 million (US\$85 million) due to earthquakes and tropical cyclones.
- In the next 50 years:
 - 50% chance of experiencing a loss exceeding F\$1.5 billion (US\$806 million),
 - 10% chance of experiencing a loss exceeding F\$3 billion (US\$1.6 billion)

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


- Institutions in charge of DRM and CC DRM
